HSE - Moving & Handling Materials Health Campaign

HSE's health focussed inspection initiative planned for quarter 3 of 2022-23

Inspection activity focus during the initiative:

- The focus will be on the risks associated with moving and handling construction materials
- The HSE Construction Division Health Initiatives are a component of the focussed effort to reduce work-related ill health and are set out in the <u>HSE</u> <u>Business Plan 2022/23</u>.

The campaign will:

- Include a 6-week inspection period from Monday 3 Oct Friday 11 Nov.
- Support HSE's continuing strategy to improve the health of construction workers focussing on the health risks associated with moving and handling construction materials.
- Support the industry by raising awareness of health issues in relation to moving and handling materials.

MSD assessment tools: (MAC /ART/ RAPP).

- A number of assessment tools have been developed to help duty holders and inspectors identify the risks from work activities that could give rise to MSDs and enable them to select and apply control measures to manage the risk effectively.
- These tools are the:-
 - Manual Handling Assessment Charts (MAC Tool updated November 2018),
 - Assessment of Repetitive Tasks (ART Tool); and
 - Risk Assessment of Pushing and Pulling (RAPP Tool).



MUSCULOSKELETAL DISORDERS (MSDS)

- MSDs include injuries and conditions that can affect the back, joints and limbs, which can reduce a person's quality of life. You can develop a musculoskeletal disorder or it can be made worse through work.
- HSE statistics show that in 2019/20, 480,000 workers suffered from work-related musculoskeletal disorders. This accounts for 8.9 million working days lost due to work-related MSDs. Do the right thing and protect your employees from work-related MSDs.

MANAGING THE RISKS OF MSDS

Employers must manage the risk of MSDs in the workplace. Tasks which have a high risk of causing MSDs include manual handling, repetitive work, awkward postures and exposure to vibration. There are also risks associated with use of display screen equipment such as PCs, laptops, tablets and smartphones.








Physics of Noise

Defined as a fluctuation in pressure above and below the ambient pressure of a medium that has elasticity and viscosity (Solid, liquid and gas)











What is HAVS?

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- □ Hand-arm vibration syndrome (HAVS) is the term used to describe the effects of hand transmitted vibration on the blood vessels, nerves, muscles and other tissues in the upper limb and is the main concern posed by exposure to vibration.
- HAVS commonly manifest itself as vibration white finger or carpal tunnel syndrome.
- HAVS is caused by the transfer of vibration through a workers hands and arms, in as little as 6 months.
- 1 in 10 people who work regularly with vibrating tools may develop HAVS.


